

Hanging Libraries: A 'Books For All' Initiative To Provide Joy Of Reading Across India

Helping Teenagers Navigate through Tough Decisions in Life:

On 19th May, Books for All in collaboration with CSR Box under their ACT SMART Initiative for teenagers, organised a session on how to navigate through the challenges of bullying, peer pressure, and underage lifestyle habits such as addiction. The session was conducted at the soft skill centre set up with the support of HCL Foundation in Sarvodaya Vidya Mandir School, Noida. It was attended by 80 students of class 10, 11 and 12. The session was conducted in a form of a 90 minute e-interview with interactive movie and live engagement with the teens. The story was presented in an engaging manner and students could relate to character and situations in their life.
