All the sessions were thoroughly enjoyed by the students.



Women from our Adult Literacy Programme learn the Basics of Banking:

BFA is a volunteer driven organization and we feel blessed to have selfless persons with us in our journey of change. Geetika Anand is one such volunteer who contributes her time to empower women through the Adult Literacy programme.
