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MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER

It gives me great pleasure to share BFA's continued commitment to the community and contribution of our benefactors and volunteers to our cause in this all-important 13th year of our operations. A great many good things happened this year which cheered and motivated us.

After a long wait, post Covid induced lockdowns and restrictions, our libraries were fully functional once again! Students immersed themselves in story books, participating in extracurricular activities, quizzes and competitions.

Four of our sponsored students who took the Class 12 CBSE Board exams secured first divisions with two girls scoring above 80 % marks. Of them, one has joined Engineering College while two students cracked CUET & are pursuing graduation in the prestigious Delhi University.



On the vocational training front, this was the third year of our partnership with HCL Foundation. The support received from HCLF enabled us to provide vocational counselling to 850 students and vocational training to 86 students. It is in line with our mission of "Skilling the Youth & make them Job Ready". We also entered into partnership with ST Foundation for the T4K Project which introduced Tablets to students of Classes 5 - 8 and Piramal Foundation in "Better World Initiative 7.0" through M/S Genpact to streamline Library Operations. More about this in the Report.

Wall Hung Libraries (WHL), a unique concept which we started as an experiment last year, blossomed into a full-fledged project. During the year we installed 88 WHL in village schools in 17 states, in 8 languages.

Mr. Vinod Luthra, from Rochester NY, a long-time well-wisher of BFA gifted a Library on his birthday benefiting 400 students of NEMP School Noida. He also agreed to sponsor our Adult Literacy Centre "Sankalp" at Gejha Village in Noida.

We are delighted to announce our association with Adobe Systems in their volunteer engagement programs.

I take this opportunity to thank all our donors, volunteers, members of the Board and Management Committee, staff and all well-wishers who helped us make the world a better place in our small humble way!

I wish all our readers and their near and dear ones a fulfilling year!

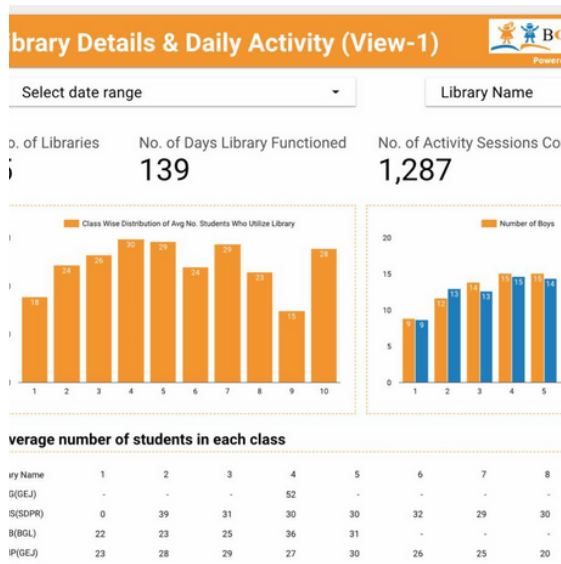

BFA's first batch of students sponsored in the year 2015 when they were in Class six took their Class 12 CBSE Board exams this year and did us proud by scoring first divisions! Radhika and Priyanka who scored above 80% marks are now pursuing graduation in the prestigious Delhi University after clearing the highly competitive CUET exam. Neeraj is pursuing his dream by studying Computer Science Engineering with Artificial Intelligence (AI) from Galgotia University. Vasudev, after completing his training in Apparel Technology from ATDC, is now placed at Shahi Export in Quality Control department with a starting salary of INR 18,000/-pm.

Under the able leadership of Ms. Lata Agarwal, Member-Management Committee, our Librarians organized a number of activities during the year apart from book reading and Storytelling. Activities included theme-based quiz and competitions in Mathematics, Science, Geography and various other subjects to increase the general awareness of the students. Apart from this, art, craft, music, dance and drama brought joy and unleashed their hidden talent. The students also celebrated Independence Day with patriotic plays and dances, Teachers Day, Earth Day (with theme-based slogan writing, poster making etc.), Diwali (with Diya decoration and rangoli making), Christmas (with craft) etc.

BFA also organised Sports Day at two Libraries where students participated in various races and team activities. Student volunteers from BFA also taught Football to students at Government Junior and Primary School Sultanpur, Noida and organised matches

The application made by Genpact not only helped BFA capture all data pertaining to libraries and generate MIS but also helped in conducting a scientific baseline assessment of the reading ability of students. Dashboard display enabled Senior Management to have firsthand latest information on each Library.

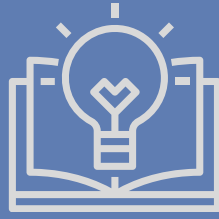
22 employees of Optum Global Solutions engaged students of NEMP School in competitions, races and football.

SPONSORED STUDENTS



36 bright students sponsored for better education

We, at Books for All, sponsor the education of bright children to change the course of their lives and also provide handholding and mentoring support to them. In 2022 with the help of our supporters we were able to admit five new students. Currently we are sponsoring the education of 16 bright and deserving students.

More than the monetary support provided by BFA, coaching, handholding and mentoring are equally, if not, more important. BFA ensures this by tracking their performance at school, arranging coaching by volunteers who can spare time and guiding students and their parents. This year, BFA student volunteers Ganeev Kaur and Tiya Sharma donated their time and effort in coaching and mentoring 4 of our students. Notable performances were those of Zainab who performed exceptionally well scoring 97% in her final exam and Soni, an exceptional **National Level** basketball player, who volunteered to be a Scribe for a Class X student with Autism studying in a prestigious Public School of Noida.





CAREER COUNSELLING AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING



**Three Years of Making First
Generation Learners Become
Job Ready**

In the year 2020, BFA signed an MOU with HCL Foundation with the aim to make more students job ready. As part of this project, BFA, in the last 3 years, has counselled more than **4200 students of 16 Inter Colleges**, schools and NGOs regarding career options, encouraged them to take up vocational courses, helped 231 impecunious students with admissions to vocational institutes fully paid by HCLF

We helped 100 students, who had completed their courses, secure jobs, and earning with dignity. BFA has also imparted soft skills and life skill training to more than **2500 students** which helped increase their awareness, build confidence and improve their personality.



This year BFA counselled **1575** students by going to Inter Colleges, primarily located in urban villages around Noida and also conducted 3 career melas in the month of November.

We admitted **86** students to Vocational Training Institutes after many rounds of counselling of students and parents. Our bouquet of course offerings included a number of Paramedical Courses, Cosmetology, Diploma in IT, Graphic Design, AC Refrigeration, Laptop Repair etc.

The journey of these students towards self-reliance and better livelihood has begun!



SANKALP

Adult Literacy Program- 53 women enrolled



In November 2021, BFA made a small beginning to empower analphabetic women of the neighborhoods, through the 'Sankalp' Adult Literacy Programme. With a firm belief that literacy is critical for empowering women to gain confidence, hold their head high in the society and earn income by starting small ventures, BFA appointed Ms.Hina, a qualified and dedicated teacher to conduct literacy sessions in a school in Gejha Village. Apart from reading, writing and mathematics, famously known as the three R's, BFA has now introduced classes in English for women who have already learnt Hindi. At present 20 women are regularly attending classes. Education, books and materials are provided to them free of cost.



A number of Volunteers pitch in with expert talks on topics like nutrition and health, financial literacy, etc. so as to give them wider exposure to issues that are important for them and their families. Geetika Anand is one such volunteer who contributes her time to empower women through the Adult Literacy program. In the month of January, she took classes with a batch of Sankalp women to explain to them the basics of banking; how to fill the deposit and withdrawal slips and the importance and use of withdrawal form and cheque. She also explained to them various other ways to deposit and withdraw money from their bank accounts.

Anshu is another volunteer who regularly handholds village women for teaching them Hindi and English

Wall Hung Libraries- a Gift of Knowledge for Lesser-privileged pan India:

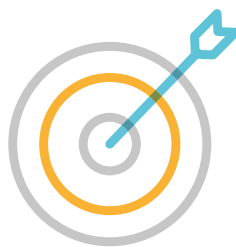
To provide good quality books to lesser privileged children studying in schools with no libraries, Books for All started a drive to raise funds for Wall Hung Libraries (WHL), each comprising about 100 beautifully illustrated story books written in simple language. The unique feature of a WHL is that it does not need any space or dedicated infrastructure, as it can be easily hung on walls.

With the concerted efforts of our well-wishers and staff, this year **we were able to give this gift of knowledge to the children of 88 schools in 17 states of India! More than 15,000** students from Rural Government Schools are benefitting from these books. Our unique initiative was also covered by ABP News

As a first-generation learner, Radhika's journey has been a challenging one. Coming from a low income family, Radhika has always had a thirst for knowledge and Books For All, having spotted her in Class V, mentored her and admitted her to Class VI in a CBSE school. Since then, BFA not only sponsored Radhika's education but also ensured that she received coaching and counselling.

Radhika did everyone proud when she scored 87% in her 12th CBSE Board exam. Her performance is all the more commendable considering that she shares a small room with seven other family members. She is now pursuing a B.A in psychology as a regular student at Delhi University after clearing the highly competitive CUET entrance competitive examination.

Radhika is an inspiration to all those who face similar challenges and proves that with the right support, anyone can achieve their dreams.



Priyanka - A story of grit and determination

Priyanka's exceptional performance during her primary classes caught the attention of BFA which sponsors bright students for continued education. Priyanka's father works as a security guard and her mother is a house help. Despite the handholding by BFA throughout her schooling, Priyanka faced a number of challenges, including repeated attempts by her family to marry her off while still at school.

Priyanka resisted pressure from her family and through sheer hard work and steely resolve, she did exceptionally well in her 12th Board Exams, cleared the highly competitive CUET exam and is now enrolled in B.Com (Hons) at Delhi University. Priyanka earns Rs 11,000 by coaching students to meet the expenses of books and commuting. She aspires to be a banker and is also preparing for competitive exams to ensure a brighter future. Thanks to the support of BFA, Priyanka has been able to overcome obstacles and pursue her dream. Her story is a testament to the power of education and the strength of the human spirit.



Shweta (Vocational Training Program Alumna)

"I am proud to be able to support my mother"

Shweta got to know about BFA through her friend who also was pursuing a vocational course with the help of Books For All. Shweta has a single mother, who earns a meagre Rs 10000 per month, and four siblings. She was determined to help her mother and family and bring them out of the financial difficulties.

BFA sponsored Shweta for a Makeup Artist Course from VLCC, which was her dream! She worked hard in her course and is now placed with Glam Studios, Narasaraopet in Andhra Pradesh, earning a salary of Rs. 22000/-

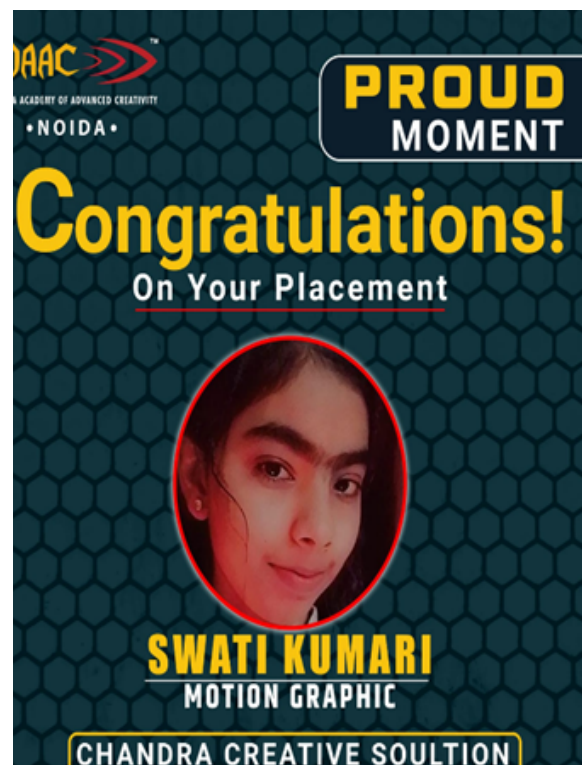
"I have become confident and financially independent and feel proud to be able to support my mother" says Shweta.



Swati (Vocational Training Program Alumnus)

"My skill has helped me to become confident and financially independent"

Swati lives in Noida with a big family of seven members. Her father is a checker in an export house earning a salary of Rs 18000 per month. She got to know about BFA through a career mela held at her Inter College when she was in class 12. In the course of her interaction with BFA volunteers during the Career Mela, Swati expressed her interest in pursuing a vocational course. After passing Class 12, she attended a counselling session at BFA during which she evinced her interest in doing a Motion graphics course. BFA got her admitted in Motion Graphics. After completion of the course, Swati joined Chandra Creative Solutions at a salary of Rs 15000. **"This course has given me much confidence and I can now support my father as well,"** says Swati.



Bandita Kanojia - Age is no barrier for education

Bandita Kanojia's lives in Gejha village near sector 93. Yet lack of schooling never stopped her from learning. Every day as she picked up her children from NEMP school, Bandita noticed the free Adult Literacy classes offered there by BFA. Without hesitation, she enrolled herself. She found companionship among other women from nearby villages attending the program. Under the guidance of BFA volunteers, Bandita embarked on her educational journey - learning basic reading and writing in Hindi and English.

A year has passed, and Bandita diligently attends classes. Pride fills her eyes as she recalls being able to read a signboard in the hospital when she took her son for an ear infection treatment. "I felt so happy that I could read the signage on my own and find my way in the hospital," she says. Her children and husband beam with joy watching Bandita read Hindi books at home. Bandita's story shows that age, gender and circumstances cannot hinder a thirst for knowledge when opportunity arises.

Adobe Volunteer Engagement Programme

It was a great opportunity for BFA to get an invite from Adobe to conduct a volunteer-engagement- programme at their sector 132 office on 15th Feb 23. Around 20 students of class 8 &9 and volunteers from BFA got a warm welcome at Adobe. It was a well-organized event where BFA gave a presentation to Adobe executives followed by a Volleyball match between our students & Adobe volunteers. BFA had also put up a stall which attracted lots of attention. The event concluded with lunch in the cafeteria of Adobe. Overall, it was a great exposure for our students from Urban Villages to visit one of the offices of a leading IT behemoth.



IMT Ghaziabad Students Intern with BFA

32 students from IMT Ghaziabad contributed their time and knowledge to strengthen our cause under Sustainability & Social Responsibility (SSR) course in the aegis of the I'm The Change Initiative. The students worked in four different projects viz, life skills, and digital literacy training, interacting with and widening horizons of students in libraries and connecting with analphabetic women from Gejha village so as to encourage them to join our adult literacy programme. Their time and efforts have undeniably helped in our cause. The students of Sarvodaya Vidya Mandir are more empowered digitally as they now have their own email ID's and are well acquainted with Microsoft Office; the attendance at our adult literacy centre has doubled and there has been a noticeable improvement in the personality of our Sultanpur and Bhangel library students. We hope that our association with IMT will continue in the coming years!

As a part of Seva Week, the prestigious **Step by Step school of Noida** invited **BFA** to address Class 4 students on virtues of Giving Back to Society. “Being involved with BFA gives me freedom and mental stimulation”

After moving to Noida, Malavika was looking for an opportunity to teach, especially the underprivileged. She came to know about BFA and joined as a volunteer in 2019. She started visiting Government Schools at Shahpur and Sultanpur where she started inculcating reading habits among children by reading stories. She also introduced word games and vocabulary exercises to the students.

“It was an amazing and fulfilling time for me. The children were really involved and in spite of the limited resources available they participated with total involvement. In Nov 2019 when BFA started a new library in Green Valley modern school I was positioned there and we did some amazing work. from quizzes, painting competitions, best from waste, science exhibition and lots of cultural activities as well. The kids loved coming to the library as it was not the same as classroom teaching. In fact, most of them borrowed books for reading which is a good sign. It was a very satisfying experience for me as I love teaching and interacting with kids. I was not keen for a full-time teaching job. Being involved with BFA gives me the freedom and mental stimulation to plan various learning experiences for the kids beyond textbook teaching”.

This flexibility has deepened my understanding of the multifaceted nature of education and the impact it can have when personalized. Interacting with these students has illuminated the power of small victories. Each step of progress, no matter how seemingly insignificant, carries immense significance. Perhaps the most impactful lesson has been the reciprocal nature of teaching. While I aimed to impart knowledge, the students have enriched my life with their stories, perspectives, and unwavering determination. Interacting with Nandani and Rashmi on a personal level and helping them enhance their language skill set has been a challenging process but the sense of contentment after each lesson is like no other.”

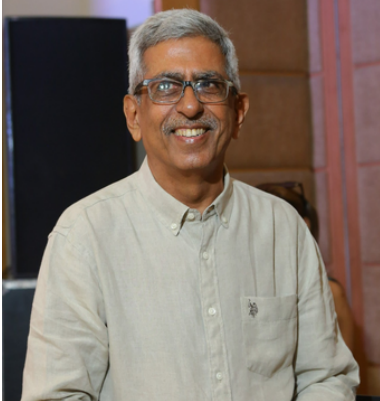
