Vocational Training Students - Learnings through an Excursion

It was an enlightening experience for 42 sponsored students of Books For All (BFA) as they embarked on a day-long knowledge tour of various places of interest across Delhi. 29 girls and 13 boys joined the tour starting from the Waste to Wonder Park where the students came to know how waste can be transformed into innovative objects, including the 7 Wonders of the World and huge, life size replicas of dinosaurs. This was followed by the National Science Centre where the students were left spellbound by the display of innumerable objects that encompasses many fascinating topics under the sun - from the human body to the Harappan era, to life underwater. It's heartening to note that most of these children have never been on a field or study trip and for many living in urban villages in Noida, this was their maiden visit to the heart of Delhi.

It was an enriching experiential outing for the students as they saw, learnt and understood things up and close. The trip ended with a fruitful ride around India Gate and Rashtrapati Bhavan and there were squeals of delight as these landmarks came into their view, peices of heritage and history that they have always heard of but never seen! "When one travels, the experiences of the place enrich us as do our interactions with the outside world," is what one of the students put it aptly. The sponsored students are learning vocational courses in Ficks BMG, VLCC and Maac Design.
