BFA Connects Visually Impaired Students with Corporate Opportunities

BFA believes that providing quality education to visually impaired students is not enough; the larger question is — what more can be done beyond Braille and Tactile Books? The obvious answer lies in supporting their employment journey.

On 2nd September, students from the National Association for the Blind (NAB), pursuing their Diploma in Computer Education, were taken to Adobe for an exposure visit and corporate learning session. BFA organized this event to create a bridge between corporates and visually impaired students — helping them interact, learn, and explore future employment opportunities. Often, corporates wish to hire such talented individuals but lack the right platform or connection to do so.

Through this initiative, BFA hopes to open more doors for collaboration with companies where these special students can secure meaningful jobs and live with dignity.

In total, 16 students and 36 Adobe employees participated in this inspiring interaction.

Arun Builds a New Life with BFA's Support



Arun's life was never easy. After his father's demise, the responsibility of supporting the family fell on his elder brother, who struggled to make ends meet. Yet, Arun never gave up on his dream of becoming self-reliant.

Through a friend, he learned about Books For All (BFA) and shared his story. After counseling, he enrolled in the Diploma in Operation Theatre Technician course — a decision that changed his life.

Gradually, Arun progressed. He began his career with Asian Home Service, then worked at Vibrat Hospital, Gurugram, and later at Manas Hospital. Today, he is employed at SRS Hospital, Sector 70, Noida earning ₹25,000 per month.

With his income, Arun supports his mother and is now pursuing a GNM (General Nursing and Midwifery) course on his own. His journey is a testament to how the right guidance and opportunity can transform struggle into success.
